Felos, the author of *Litigation as Spiritual Practice*, has championed the cause of death with dignity since the late 1980s, when he argued Florida’s landmark right-to-die case. Since that time—as an attorney, educator, Hospice patient volunteer, and Board Chair of the world’s largest non-profit Hospice—he has helped countless families and patients in their quest for humane and dignified end-of-life care. He has appeared on numerous television and radio programs including NBC’s *Today Show*, CBS’s *Early Show*, CNN’s *Connie Chung Tonight*, *Daybreak*, *Greenfield at Large* and *Burden of Proof*, Court TV’s *Pros and Cons*, *Inside Edition*, the *Kathy Fountain Show*, and *All Things Considered*. He also teaches “Meditation for Lawyers.”
